KENJI IDE


Kenji Ide's exhibition "Boy Meets Girl" centers on the subtle manifestations of human emotions and relationships, translating them into three-dimensional objects. Drawing inspiration from Leos Carax's film, Ide explores the delicate dynamics of communication and physical proximity, such as a slight shift in gaze or the tilt of a body during conversation. He captures these nuances through sculptures by aligning materials, like pieces of wood, to evoke the gentle interplay between individuals.

In his works, ordinary objects—spheres, rods, and found items—become symbols of human interaction. By slanting and arranging these materials, Ide

creates sculptures that appear to embody human sensitivities. This transformation of inorganic materials into emotional representations reflects his interest in how we inhabit separate, yet interconnected, emotional territories.

Ide's art, informed by his personal memories and the cultural shifts of the 1990s, merges geometric abstraction with profound emotional resonance. His objects invite viewers to reflect on their own relationships, offering a poetic meditation on memory, connection, and the emotional significance of everyday interactions.

Kenji Ide was born in 1981 in Kanagawa Prefecture, Japan. Graduated School of Painting at Tama Art University in 2006. Currently resides in Tokyo. Kenji Ide's artistic practice focuses on creating three-dimensional objects that blend personal experiences, memories, and emotions into tangible form. Over the past 15 years, the Japanese artist has developed a distinctive style of assemblage, utilizing materials like wood, paper, wax, and found objects to produce intricate and evocative sculptures—or "objects," as he prefers to call them. This preference for the term "objects" over "sculptures" highlights the intimate and personal connection he feels with his creations, reflecting his deep attachment to everyday items.

The core of Ide's work is centered around the idea of transforming memories and personal history into physical objects. His compositions, often appearing like miniature architectural models or abstract puzzles, evoke an ambiguous yet familiar feeling. They suggest purpose or logic without fully revealing their meaning, inviting viewers to reflect on their own interpretations and associations. Through the spatial arrangement of geometric shapes—spheres, rods, crosses, and more recognizable elements like feet or flowers—Ide creates a poetic narrative that engages viewers on an emotional and nostalgic level.

In his current exhibition, "Boy Meets Girl" Ide draws inspiration from Leos Carax's film of the same name, using his sculptures to explore the complex dynamics of human relationships. He metaphorically uses rivers to represent the connections and distances between people. Works like "Light on the Other Side of the River" and "This Rain Will Continue" embody these themes, with carefully aligned materials expressing sensitivity and subtle nuances that mirror the ebb and flow of personal relationships. Ide's exploration of these interactions is delicate, often evoking the shared yet distinctly personal experiences that define human connection.

Ide's works are also rooted in the landscapes and environments he has encountered throughout his life. This sense of place and memory contributes to the emotional weight of his objects, which often evoke feelings of nostalgia and introspection in viewers. Although intimately tied to the artist's personal history, these sculptures also resonate universally, inviting viewers to project their own memories and emotions onto the pieces. In this way, Ide's work acts as a bridge between the artist's internal world and the viewer's own experience, fostering a shared sense of connection and understanding.

Throughout his career, Ide has consistently engaged with themes of time, memory, and personal attachment, using his objects to reflect on how people interact with the material world. His works, crafted with precision and care, serve as physical manifestations of memories, emotions, and personal experiences, bringing the intangible into the tangible. As viewers engage with Ide's creations, they are invited to reflect not only on the artist's narrative but also on their own relationships with the objects and spaces that shape their lives.

Ultimately, Kenji Ide's art offers a profound meditation on the emotional significance of objects, memories, and human relationships, encouraging viewers to find beauty and meaning in the everyday.
