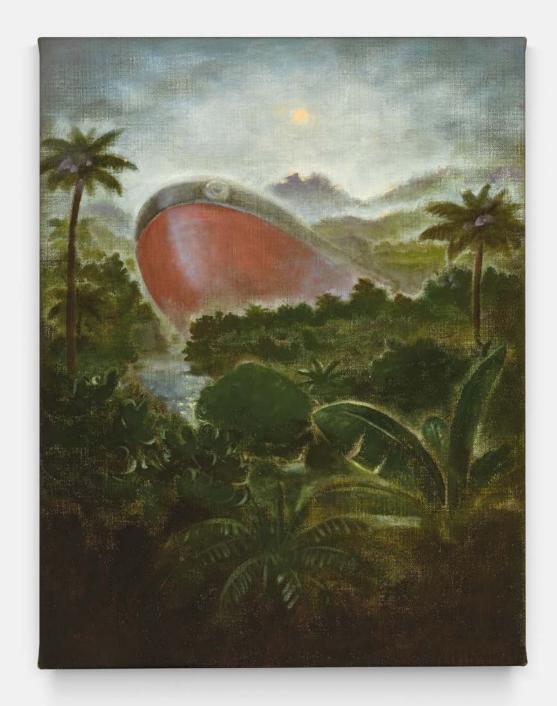

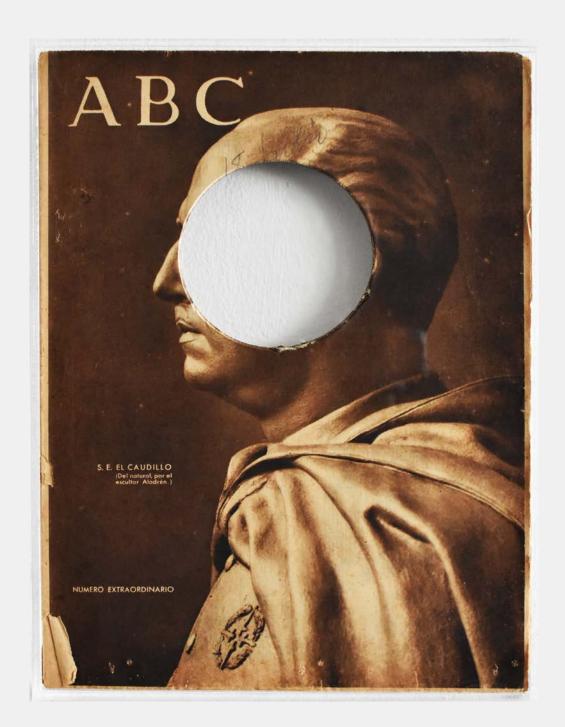

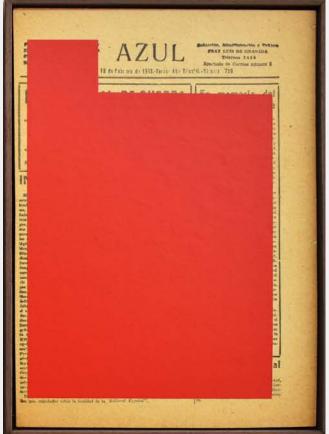

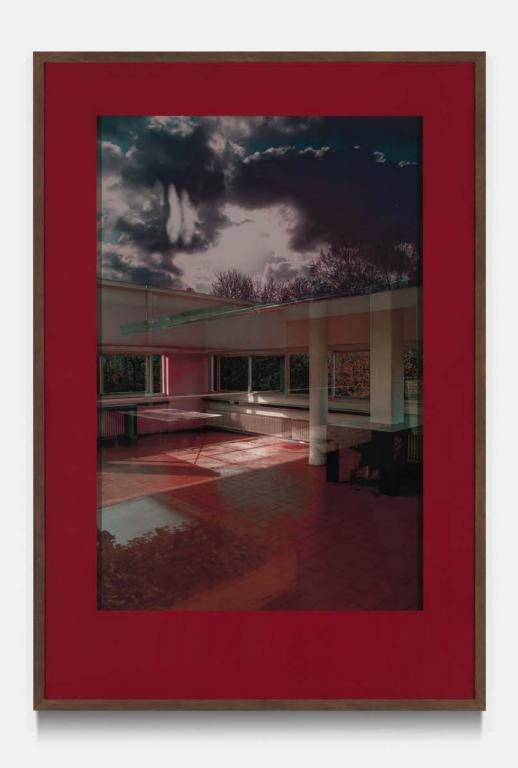

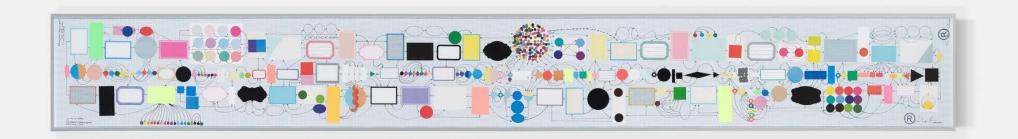

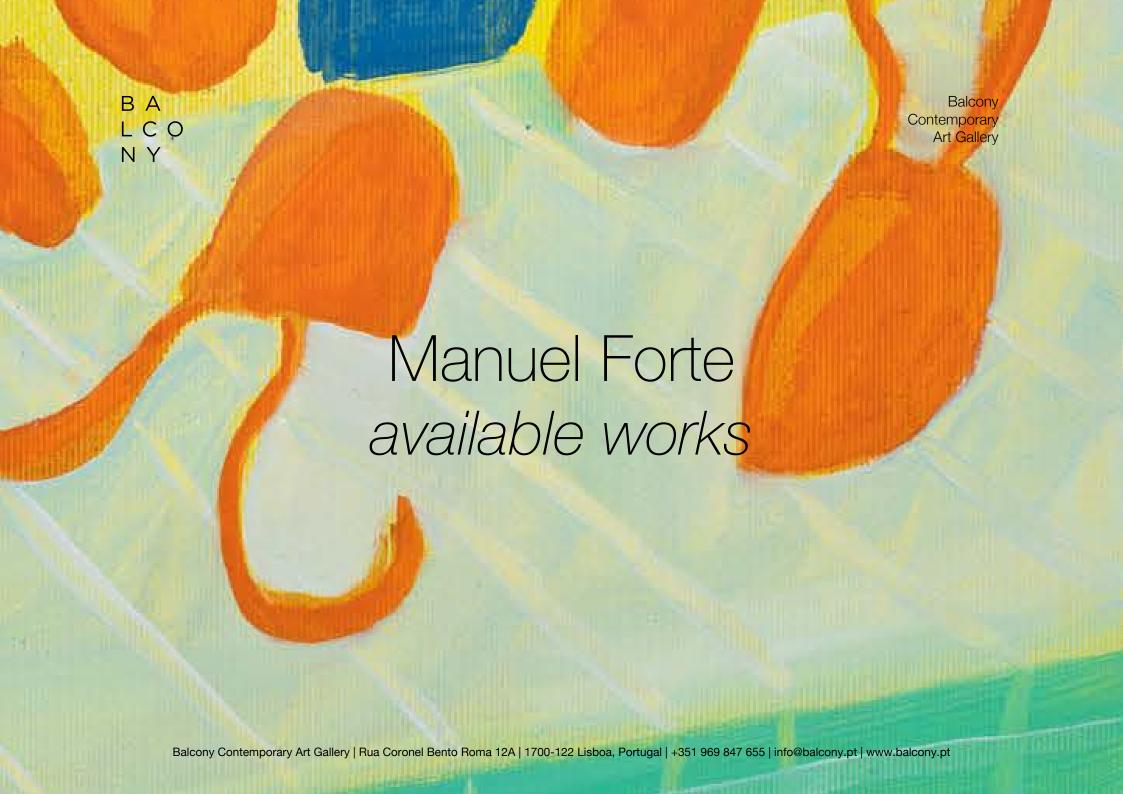

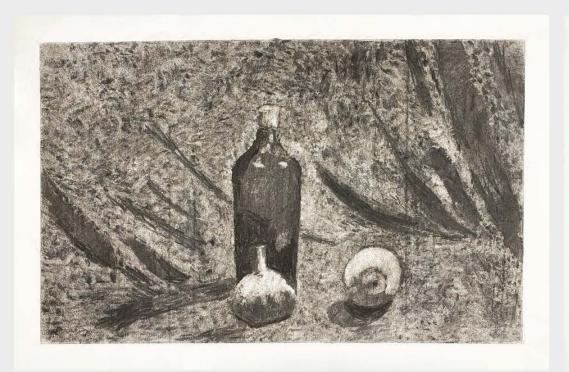

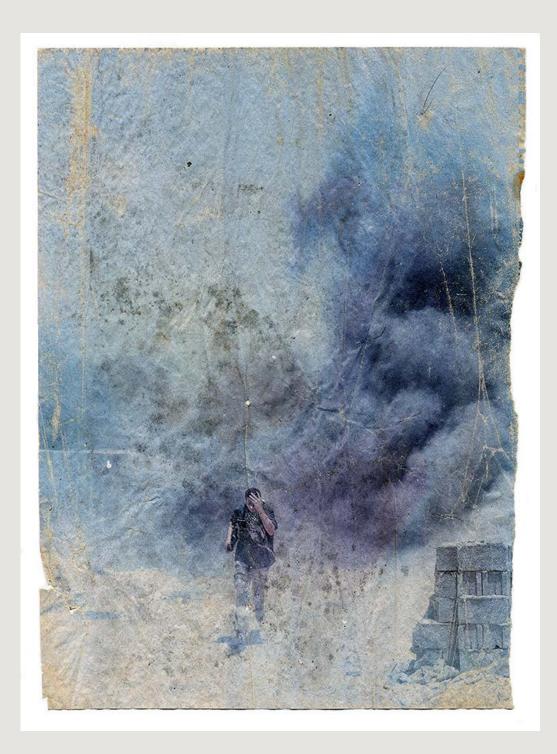

Artist's Bios

Carolina Serrano (b. 1994, Funchal, Portugal) lives and works between Cologne (DE) and Lisbon (PT).

She has a BA and MA in Sculpture from the Faculty of Fine Arts, University of Lisbon, as well as a postgraduate degree in Art Curatorship from FCSH, NOVA University Lisbon.

Serrano has been exhibiting her work regularly since 2018, with the following solo exhibitions standing out: Inside of, Matjö - Raum für Kunst, Cologne (DE, 2024); Closed fists, open wrists, Galerie Alex Serra, Cologne (DE, 2023); Teeth to the bone, Text by Susana Ventura, UMA LULIK_ Gallery, Lisbon (PT, 2023); What words to name, Text by Wilko Austermann, Galerie Alex Serra, Cologne (DE, 2021); Between the thumb and index finger, Text by Alexandre Melo, Galeria UMA LULIK_, Lisbon (PT, 2020) and Forever about to end, Curated by Mattia Tosti, Galeria FOCO, Lisbon (PT, 2020).

In 2020, Serrano received a grant from the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation's Visual Arts Support Programme. In 2021 she also received the Auf Geht's Stipendum grant from the Ministry of Culture of North Rhine-Westphalia (DE) and in 2022 the NEUSTART KULTUR work and production grant from the Stiftung Kunstfonds Foundation, Bonn (DE). In 2022, she was named by Arteinformado as one of the 7 Women Artists of the Future at ARCO Madrid 2022.

Serrano's work and research revolve around the temporal dimension of sculpture, the dematerialisation of sculpture and the attempt to understand what it means to be human, exploring opposing concepts such as good/bad, inside/outside, freedom/enclosure, violence/innocence, light/shadow. The concept of 'being-in-between', which is linked to the attempt to understand what it means to be human, through the notion of duality and antagonism, is fundamental to her work, since this 'in-between space' is what she aims to embody through sculpture.

Hugo Brazão (b. 1989, Madeira) lives and works in Lisbon, Portugal.

His artistic practice covers painting, sculpture and textile and develops around the fiction/reality paradox, reimagining the material found within his research and finding its technical possibilities and different narratives that can be created around it. Brazão was awarded the VIA Arts Prize in 2018 in London, the Helen Scott Lidgett Studio Award in 2015 and participates regularly in international art residencies. He completed an MA in Fine Arts at Central Saint Martins (London, 2015) and a BA in Painting at Faculdade de Belas Artes de Lisbon (2013).

Recent solo exhibitions include: "Toad on the moon" (2023), Casa A. Molder Gallery, Lisbon, Portugal; "Snake n a cookie jar" (2023), Voda Seoul Gallery, South Korea; "Forrado" (2023) duo com Ana Vidigal, Centro Cultural Quinta Magnólia, Madeira, Portugal; "What's for dinner?" (2022), Balcony Gallery, Lisbon; "Cat Did It!" (2021), Commonage, London, United Kingdom; "Out of sight, out of mind" (2020), Balcony Gallery, Lisbon; "Best foot backwards" (2019), Sala Brasil, Londron; "TAKE TEN" (2019), Las Palmas, Lisbon. He has also been exhibiting in group exhibitions in the United Kingdom, Portugal, Spain and Italy.

Brazão has also been taking part in several art residencies in Germany, Norway, France, Portugal and the UK.

Hugo Brazão is currently represented in public and private collections.

(Portalegre, 1978), lives and works in Lisbon, Portugal. Mané Pacheco studied and worked in Nature Conservation before joining FBAUL, where she graduated in Multimedia Arts distinguished with a merit scholarship from the University of Lisbon and the BPI/FBAUL 2010 Award.

Both areas of training (art and environment) are manifested in a body of work that expands interdisciplinary and uses the materiality and semiotics of objects to address biological, physiological and sociological aspects of the ecology of relations (of power).

In 2010, she was selected for an Artistic Residency 'Creadores de Iberoamérica y de Haití en México' as a grant-holder for the Fondo Nacional para la Cultura y las Artes – CONACULTA, having exhibited in the Museo Diego Rivera-Anahuacalli and in the Centro Cultural de España en México. In the same year, Mané participated in the Landart Cascais Festival and since then she has exhibited there regularly.

For most recent individual projects we highlight solo show at PLHK Gallery, partnership with 'Document Space', Chigaco IL, USA; 'Arco Lisboa 2023' solo project with Balcony Gallery; ('Bestas') at Galeria Francisco Fino, project 'Belo Campo'; the Bienal Anozero '22 Meia-noite ('Criatura' and 'Soft Skilled'); Walk & Talk Azores Festival 2021 ('Pelágica') and the individual-dou at Balcony Gallery ('A naturally false snake'). She also has participated in exhibitions at Culturgest Porto, Internacional Center of Arts José de Guimarães, MU.SA - Museu das Artes de Sintra, Fidelidade Art Space, 'Arco Madrid 2022', Berardo Collection Museum, National Museum of Contemporary Art, 'Drawing Room Lisboa' - SNBA; Galeria Municipal de Almada, Museu de Arte Contemporânea de Elvas, Colégio das Artes da Universidade de Coimbra, among others.

Mané's work is represented in several collections, including António Cachola Collection, Norlinda and José Lima Collection Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation, Portuguese State Contemporary Art Collection, Lisbon City Council Collection, William Allen Word & Image, Galeria Zé dos Bois and Museu das Artes de Sintra.

Manuel Aja Espil (1987) was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina, and is currently based in Madrid, Spain. An aspiring filmmaker, he began studying Film which he later abandoned to devote himself to painting. Self-taught, he learned to paint by imitating historical styles at a young age and reading art history books. Aja Espil's painting is born out of a need to create worlds.

Manuel Aja Espil participated in the Artists' Program at Torcuato Di Tella University (Buenos Aires, 2016), at Skowhegan School of Painting & Sculpture (Maine, 2019) and at the International Studio & Curatorial Program (New York, 2022). He is a 2024 Pollock-Krasner Foundation grantee, Elizabeth Greenshields Foundation grantee (Canada, 2022 and 2023), and a Fondo Nacional de las Artes' grant recipient (Argentina, 2018). His work was exhibited in MALBA Museum, Proa Foundation, as well as other private venues in Buenos Aires, Spain and New York.

Porto, Portugal, 1978 Lives and works in Mexico City, Mexico.

Manuel Forte is a Portuguese-born and Mexico City-based artist working across painting, drawing, sculpture and installation. By combining these mediums he creates large-scale immersive environments that attain dimensionality through the poetic use of found objects and an approach to muralism that challenges traditional notions of where two-dimensional painting ends and sculpture begins. Thus posing the question: what is more important, the environment on which paintings are exhibited or the paintings themselves?

His work addresses themes relating to domesticity and fantasy, reflecting on how domestic environments influence artistic production, favoring the personal, subjective and trivial experiences of everyday life that we share with friends and family.

Forte's painting is aspirational and optimistic, with a playful and vibrant approach. His practice dialogues with the pictorial tradition through gestural interventions, unexpected compositions, colorful prints and figurative suggestions, sometimes recalling the use of color, perspective and the exploration of intimacy that characterizes the work of Pierre Bonnard. He seeks to create sensorial experiences in which the viewer can (literally) inhabit, interact and relate. In this way, he manages to dispel the sense of preciousness associated with art, inviting the public to dive into worlds that feel familiar yet novel.

In 2011 Manuel Forte graduated in Painting at Ar.Co Lisboa and took the Video Art course of the "Gulbenkian Program of Creation and Artistic Creativity", at the Gulbenkian Foundation (Lisbon, PT). His works have been exhibited in several countries such as Spain, Germany, Mexico and Portugal. In 2024 he had a solo show at Galería Karen Huber (CDMX, MX) "is anybody here?" and participated in solo and group exhibitions in galleries such as Nixxxon (CDMX, MX), König Mexico City (CDMX, MX), Siheyuan Hua International (Berlin, DE) and in fairs such as Material (2023, CDMX, MX), Arco Madrid (2024, Madrid, ES) and The Armory Show (2024, NY, USA).

Nikolai Nekh was born in 1985, in Slavhansk-na-Kubani, Russia. He currently lives and works in Lisbon, Portugal.

In 2009, he got a degree on Art and Multimedia at Faculdade de Belas Artes, Lisbon. The following year he took part in the Independent Studies Programme at Maumaus, Lisbon.

Nekh's artwork consists of the production and distribution of images that come from capitalism trajectories and their forms of representation.
